





## **Programme Architecture & Contacts Overview**



- "Contact" refers to the "contact days" when classes or sessions are held. These sessions include physical or online classes depending on the type of contact
- There are total six contacts for the entire duration of the programme and each term is divided into two contacts.
- There is a gap of 8 weeks between two contacts which is used to complete the readings, application exercises, field assignments, group works and examinations
- For three contacts, students have to come to SPJIMR's Mumbai campus and remaining three contacts are held online
- For online contacts, sessions are held after lunch on weekdays and the entire day on Sundays
- Contact duration varies from 9 to 16 days; total contact days are about 80 and contact hours are about 400
- Contacts and examinations calendar for the entire year of the programme is given to students before taking admissions to help them plan their work and leaves


Thirty-two top-class faculty members from SPJIMR, including both core and adjunct faculty, alongside visiting experts from outside

### Application process: Applications are invited on a rolling basis

Only shortlisted candidates are called for online interview.

The sponsored candidates are required to attach a letter from the sponsoring organisation supporting their candidacy along with the application



Applicants are expected to fill out the online application form on the SPJIMR PGPDM admission portal after carefully reading the brochure

An application processing fee of Rs. 1000 has to be paid while filling up the application form

### **Important Information:**

- Selected candidates must present original documents verifying educational qualifications, professional experience, identity, and address upon reporting to the campus.
- Discrepancies between information provided in the application form and supporting documents may result in admission cancellation without refund of the application processing fee.
- Only shortlisted candidates for the interview and those selected thereafter will receive communication from SPJIMR.
- Selected candidates must secure support from their organization for joining as the programme demands unwavering commitment and dedication.

## **Selection process:**



Applicants are shortlisted based on their profiles and the information provided in the application form.



Shortlisted candidates are invited for an online personal interview with the faculty of SPJIMR.



Selection for the PGPDM programme is based on the candidate's performance in the interview.

#### Programme fee

I. Corporate/International NGO-sponsored & high-income candidates

Rs. 3,00,000 (Three Lakh only) + GST as applicable.

Payment terms: In advance – 2 options

- a) Full payment Rs. 3,00,000+ GST as applicable
- b) Term-wise payment: Rs. 1,00,000 + GST as applicable x 3 Terms

II. NGO Candidates or those who are selfsponsored

Rs. 1,50,000 (One Lakh Fifty Thousand only) + GST as applicable.

Payment terms: In advance – 3 options

- a) Full payment Rs. 1,50,000 + GST as applicable
- b) Term-wise payment: Rs. 50,000 + GST as applicable x 3 Terms
- c) Equal Monthly Instalments (EMI) Rs. 16,100 per month for 11 months. First EMI payment will have to be made for the confirmation of admission & for remaining 10 EMIs, Post Dated Cheques will have to be submitted on the day of reporting.

III. Discount in Fee - For two or more persons joining from the same NGO a concession of Rs. 10,000/- per candidate will be provided.

Scholarships are available for low income deserving candidates.

## **Accommodation Policy**

The on-campus component of the programme is residential.

Accommodation and food costs are subsidized and have to be covered by the students.

Participation in the programme mandates that selected candidates reside together in accommodation arranged by the programme during on-campus contacts as this facilitates peer learning, community building and ensures complete dedication to the program during the on-campus contact.
